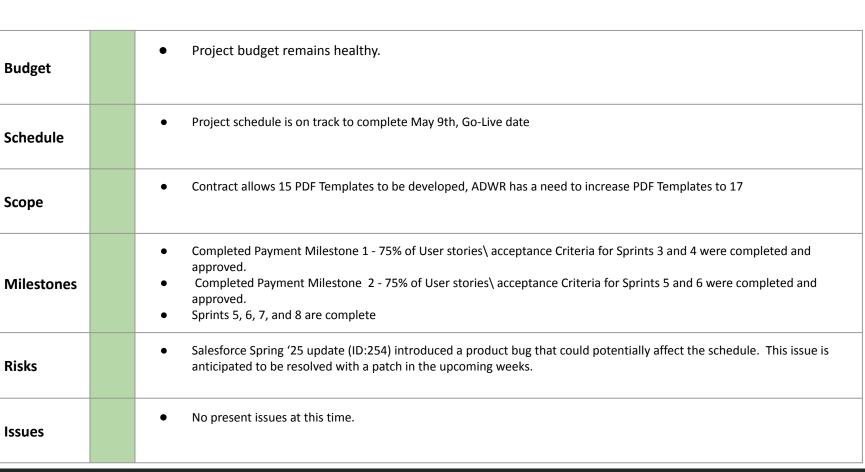

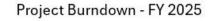

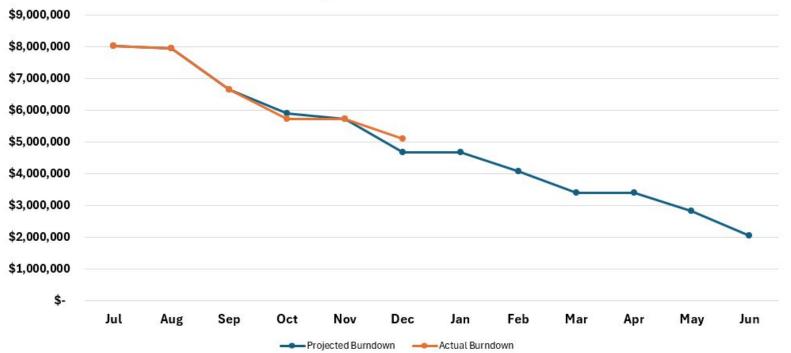

Latest IV&V Findings Report - 01/2025

- Focus on UAT Testing UAT planning needs a more detailed and robust plan with a set timeline of events. Better-defined test scripts and process flows. Increased focus on UAT need to be put in place.
 - O **ADWR Response:** ADWR has created a UAT team bringing in additional resources to focus on test scripts and the process flow.
- **Obtain Early External Feedback** Actively engage with state government affiliates, including cities and counties, during the development External Stakeholder Plan. Gather and incorporate their feedback early.
 - O ADWR Response: ADWR Change Management Team is in the process of planning the External Stakeholders communication plan and roll out.
- Critical Staffing Needs for Additional Business Unit Development Staff augmentation is needed to manage the system upgrades prior to any substantial development.
 - **ADWR Response:** ADWR believes that the current team's skillset is sufficient for maintaining and enhancing the developed areas of the system. For the development of new areas, additional upskilling efforts are underway, however our development will be inhibited without additional resources.
- Focus Critical Resources on High Impact Items Prioritize offloading tasks that can be done by others from the Product Owner team's responsibilities.
 - ADWR Response: ADWR is working with the Salesforce Team and the Product Owner team to realign the priorities of the project tasks. As the project continues to move closer to completion the Product Owner team responsibilities will become lighter as activities transition from project build to testing and training.

- WAVES Project Team Productivity Remains High As of January 16, 2025, the WAVES project is completing tasks according to its implementation timeline.
- **Project Budget Remains Healthy** Salesforce and ADWR continue to indicate that the project budget is on track.
