The current project was to centralize the A-Plus server infrastructure, and allow all thin clients across the state to communicate directly with a server located at Central Office. 250 thin clients were purchased to be installed at Lewis Prison Complex, and a Dell VRTX converged infrastructure server was purchased and installed at the Central Office data center.

To expand the program, 320 thin clients will be purchased, to be installed at Douglas, Winslow and Safford prison complexes. Windows Server and SQL Server licenses must be purchased in order for the VRTX server to operate correctly. Network expansion cards will be purchased to increase network redundancy on the server, and prevent outages. A software license must also be purchased for Wyse Device Manager (WDM) Enterprise, to allow the expanded, statewide solution to be managed. An upgrade for the Reading Horizons software must also be purchased in order to allow the software to work effectively over hundreds of clients.

Business Justification Summary

Extension of LAN services to all prison facilities ensures equal opportunity and access to all education curriculum for inmates. By Joining all separate LAN sites under once central server and location, the process of delivery of our educational service is more efficient and economical. There is no need for duplication of servers since all will be joined to the central server. This facilitates improved access to student data regardless of where the inmate is housed or transferred to. Upkeep and implementing updates and changes are improved when a centralized control system is in place.
