

Summary of Health Information Exchange (HIE) Enterprise

Grant Program Awardees

Name of Awardee: Jewish Family and Children Services (JFCS) / BHINAZ:

Type of Organization: Health Information Exchange Organization (HIO)

Award Amount: \$200,000 (Revised Budget Award Amount: \$200,000)

HIE grant funds will allow BHINAZ to purchase Consent Management (CM) and Enterprise Master Patient Index (EMPI) software necessary to bring at least three of four identified behavioral health provider organizations into the HIE by the end of the six month grant period. Funding will also be used to purchase an HIE Hospital Interface Bundle (NextGen) which allows for sharing of additional data elements including lab bidirectional interface and CCD Continuity of Care Interface which will help HIE participants qualify for elements of meaningful use (stage two) requirements. As BHINAZ expands the capacity of the HIE to include additional providers, those providers will also be further enabled to meet meaningful use requirements.

Name of Awardee: Tuba City Regional Healthcare Organization

Type of Organization: Integrated Delivery Network (IDN)

Award Amount: \$200,000 (Revised Budget Award Amount: \$134,525)

This funding will assist TCRHCC by funding the costs associated with the implementation and functional use of HIE, including purchasing ALERT INPATIENT and EMERGENCY ROOM v.2.6.3.17 inclusive of installation, technical support and training, the HINAZ one time onboarding connection fee, HINAZ quarterly fees and other technology costs incurred to facilitate seamless electronic transfer of patient health information across different provider networks and unaffiliated organizations.

Name of Awardee: Dignity Health

Type of Organization: Integrated Delivery Network (IDN); Enterprise Wide Health Information Exchange (HIE)

Award Amount: \$191,870 (Revised Budget Award \$185,792)

The award of this grant will allow Dignity Health to enhance the capabilities of our Enterprise HIE deployment in Arizona. We will immediately begin to connect the St. Josephs' Medical Group's Allscripts Ambulatory EMR to the exchange using the Integrating the Healthcare Enterprise (IHE) Cross Enterprise Document Sharing profile (XDS.b), transmitting the ONC-specified document standards for Meaningful Use Stage 1/2 Transitions of Care (e.g., C32 CCDs or Consolidated CDA).



This connection will allow SJMG to begin contributing Care Summaries into the exchange that can be shared and accessed by other exchange participants. While C32 CCDs will be shared initially, this connection will serve as the transport mechanism for Consolidated CDA documents once they are available in our ambulatory systems.

Name of Awardee: People of Color Network

Type of Organization: Behavioral Health Provider/Primary Care; Enterprise Wide Health Information Exchange (HIE); Integrated Delivery Network

Award Amount: \$200,000 (Revised Budget Award Amount: \$200,000)

HIE grant funds will allow People of Color Network Health to implement an HIE Enterprise Work Plan HIE and GSI Health Coordinator tool to share electronic information and real-time care coordination for the network with three identified integrated behavioral health organizations. Funds will go toward the purchase of HISP Vendor and HINAz fees. People of Color's Network's strategy is to optimize HINAz's bidirectional communication with area hospitals and inpatient facilities to develop an admission alert system within their HIE platform to increase admission notification to providers and improve patient outcomes.

Name of Awardee: Commonwealth Primary Care Accountable Care Organization (CPCACO)

Type of Organization: Accountable Care Organization (ACO)

Award Amount: \$200,000

The HIE grant will allow the Commonwealth Primary Care ACO to implement direct messaging protocols between the provider practices and their partners in related healthcare enterprises. This direct and secure message that includes patient data will facilitate transitional care between different provider offices and other healthcare facilities. In addition, the HIE grant will facilitate implementation of an HIE that will allow CPCACO to more quickly and effectively share patient care summaries and related patient care data between the physicians, care coordinators and other healthcare care partners.

Funding is provided by the Office of National Coordinator for Health Information Technology, a Department of Health and Human Services. The HIE Enterprise sub-grant program, which is in turn a project of the Arizona Governor's Office of Economic Recovery and the Arizona Strategic Enterprise Technology Office, a division of the Arizona Department of Administration.

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
