b. Arizona Department of Administration Exhibit 2 AD17013 – Hosted Mainframe Meeting Packet

ADOA currently utilizes an IBM Mainframe system to process business data for various state agencies. The current configuration consists of a z/12 processor, and a DS8100 disk and TS7740 Virtual tape subsystems for data storage. These systems are housed in the State Datacenter, and ADOA maintains a staff of approximately 32 FTE's in support of Administration and 24x7 Operations. Seeking 3rd-party hosting and managed service options for the mainframe can ensure a stable environment and on-demand growth for processing and/or storage needs, while eliminating the burden of direct ownership of the mainframe. Migrating the ADOA Mainframe system to a Cloud environment will provide enhanced capabilities, enhanced uptime during system maintenance, and a robust Disaster Recovery/Business Continuity capability.

c. Arizona Department of Child Safety (DCS) Exhibit 3 CH17002 – CHILDS Replacement Project – Informational Only

As part of the core functions, the Arizona Department of Child Safety (DCS) caseworkers spend time to ensure the safety of children, strengthen families, and achieve permanency. The current system used for case management, federal reporting, and provider management is the Children's Information Library and Data Source, known as CHILDS. CHILDS was originally implemented in 1997, and due to the age, complexity, and inefficiencies, DCS is unable to provide the best support for the caseworkers or the children and families that they serve.
